

**2010 SANDY MOUNTAIN FESTIVAL PARADE
RULES AND REGULATIONS**

Looking To The Future

The Sandy Mountain Festival Parade Committee reserves the right to remove any entrant not conforming to rules and regulations or any entrant refusing to follow instructions of police or parade officials.

THROWING AND/OR HANDOUTS

ABSOLUTELY NO THROWING OR HANDING OUT OF ANY KIND ALLOWED ALONG THE PARADE ROUTE.

Due to non-compliance of past parade rules, we have no choice but to put this rule in place. Do not distribute ANYTHING along the parade route. This includes spraying the crowd with water or any other liquids or confetti. Do not even bring them with you.

Any entrant that does not follow this rule will be removed from the parade immediately and not be invited to participate in future years.

Due to insurance concerns, this also could be cause for cancelling future parades.

NUISANCES

No nuisance type floats or groups (fireworks, water balloons, excessive noise, etc.) will be permitted.

POLITICS

Entries advocating, opposing or depicting any political, social or religious issues are not acceptable material of display. No promotion of political candidates. Improper use of the American Flag will not be permitted.

ALCOHOL

Alcoholic beverages are forbidden on any float, in any vehicle or on the person of any participant. Any person consuming alcohol during the parade will be removed from the parade.

BEING HELPFUL

- **Someone must be able to move your vehicle at all times.** A driver needs to be within 20 feet of the steering wheel at all times. We are constantly adjusting to line up in order.
- **Tollgate Inn** is a place of business. Do no park your car/vehicle in their parking lot.
- **Entries with Animals** will need to provide their own pooper-scooper.
- **Cleanup** your own site taking your garbage with you or placing it in a proper receptacle.
- **Please be courteous** to your neighbors.

SAFETY

- **Fire extinguishers** must be attached to each float and visible to the parade committee.
- **Good brakes are required!**
- **Can your driver see?** - For maximum safety, all floats must be designed to provide full exposure of the driver's head with 180 degree vision to the front and sides of the entry.

RESPONSIBILITY

The person signing the application is responsible to see that all the participants in his/her group know all the rules.

USE OF THE THEME is encouraged whenever possible. All persons participating in the parade should be in costume or uniform.

Parade participants may not accost or mingle with parade route spectators!

FLOATS

A float shall be deemed a self-propelled, towed or animal drawn vehicle suitably decorated.

Maximum width 16 feet

Maximum height13 feet

Maximum length60 feet

Maximum frame clearance from the ground10 inches

Be sure to include the length of your unit on the entry form so we can give you enough room to work with in the set up area.

APPLICATIONS – Deadline June 30, 2010*

Please fill out and mail in your application with the appropriate fees. Include a Self Addressed Stamped Business sized envelope.

** Applications received after the deadline will be charged an additional \$25.00.*

PARADE DAY CHECK IN – July 8, 2010

4:30 – 5:30 pm

If not previously taken care of, entry fees must be paid at the time of registration. If left unpaid, entry will be unable to participate. **Entry fees are triple on the day of parade.**
